



Dear Parish Family

Good things happen in threes, and this weekend we celebrate the Feast of Thanksgiving for Holy Communion, also known as Corpus Christi. These three great feasts which we have observed these last weeks: Pentecost, Trinity, and Corpus Christi, speak to us about how we are as Church. We are lead and guided by the Spirit; our faith is in the Triune God, and we are nourished in Sacrament and word.

I'm writing this before our afternoon tea on Thursday with our amazing parish volunteers. There will be lots of photos in next week's pewslip. Our volunteers are literally our life beat.

As a Parish Community we are committed to the ongoing work of being a safe, welcoming, inclusive, and affirming place for all. We are committed to the journey of *Makarrata* – reconciliation with First Nations peoples. Thank you also for your ongoing prayers for our LGBTQIA+ community, at this time when their validity and identity continues to be challenged and questioned.

ORGAN SCHOLAR: Last week we made the very exciting announcement of the appointment of Gerard Nichols as our Organ Scholar. Gerard will be commissioned on Sunday. A MASS ON UKRAINIAN FOLKSONGS: This week (as I write this, it is day 470 of the Russian invasion), we have been shocked by the scenes of destruction caused by the bombing of the Kherson Dam. Last year, David Banney composed this Mass setting in response to the invasion, and as a way of standing in solidarity with the people of Ukraine. On the first anniversary of its premiere, the Mass will be offered again on Sunday 25th June at 10.00am. Please invite others to come and pray with the people of Ukraine.

ATTENDING WORSHIP: I am very aware of rising COVID-19 infection rates as we come into winter. Please continue to be mindful of COVIDSafe practices as we gather, and to be mindful of our own health and vulnerabilities as well as those in our community. Please strongly consider wearing a mask in places, including church, where you feel you are not able to adequately maintain physical distancing.

The sacrament is administered in both kinds. You are welcome to receive in one or both kinds. We ask that you do not intinct (dip) the host.

Finally, this week's poem, is by Evelyn Underhill. The opening image of the bird flitting above the sanctuary caught my attention, as we have often watched birds flying in the cathedral. Underhill extends this image to make us aware that our worship is caught up with all creation. I'm not ashamed to admit that I needed to look up the meaning of *kine* – cows! The final stanza of the poem breaks the rhythm of the preceding, grounding our reflections in incarnate theology.

Missa Cantata

Once in an Abbey-church, the whiles we prayed
All silent at the lifting of the Host,
A little bird through some high window strayed ;
And to and fro
Like a wee angel lost
That on a sudden finds its heaven below,
It went the morning long.
And made our Eucharist more glad with song.

It sang, it sang ! and as the quiet priest
Far off about the lighted altar moved,
The awful substance of the mystic feast
All hushed before,
It, like a thing that loved
Yet loved in liberty, would plunge and soar
Beneath the vault in play
And thence toss down the oblation of its lay.

The walls that went our sanctuary around
Did, as of old, to that sweet summons yield.
New scents and sounds within our gates were found ;
The cry of kine.

The fragrance of the field,
All woodland whispers, hastened to the shrine :
The country side was come
Eager and joyful, to its spirit's home.

Far-stretched I saw the cornfield and the plough,
The scudding cloud, the cleanly-running brook,
The humble, kindly turf, the tossing bough
That all their light
From Love's own furnace took —
This altar, where one angel brownly bright
Proclaimed the sylvan creed.
And sang the Benedictus of the mead.

All earth was lifted to communion then.
All lovely life was there to meet its King ;
Ah, not the little arid souls of men
But sun and wind
And all desirous thing
The ground of their beseeching here did find ;
All with one self-same bread.
And all by one eternal priest, were fed.

In the Beginning, not in time or space,
But in the quick before both space and time,
In Life, in Love, in co-inherent Grace,
In three in one and one in three, in rhyme,
In music, in the whole creation story,
In His own image, His imagination,
The Triune Poet makes us for His glory,
And makes us each the other's inspiration.
He calls us out of darkness, chaos, chance,
To improvise a music of our own,
To sing the chord that calls us to the dance,
Three notes resounding from a single tone,
To sing the End in whom we all begin;
Our God beyond, beside us and within.





An evening with
Noel Pearson
on *The Uluru Statement from the Heart*

Listen to Noel's story as he speaks about his connection to Aboriginal Spirituality, his work on the Uluru Statement and the Voice to Parliament referendum, followed by a Q&A panel session.

Noel Pearson comes from the Guugu Yimidhirr community of Hope Vale on the south-eastern Cape York Peninsula. Noel was one of 250 delegates who adopted the Uluru Statement from the Heart.

Mr Pearson is a lawyer, Founder and Director of Strategy of the Cape York Partnership and Founder and Co-Chair of Good to Great Schools Australia. He also co-founded the Cape York Land Council, and helped to establish Apunipima Health Council, Balkanu Cape York Development Corporation and Indigenous Enterprise Partnerships.

Mr Pearson served as a member of the Expert Panel on Constitutional Recognition of Indigenous Australians and the Referendum Council. In 2022 he was appointed by the government to the Referendum Working Group and Referendum Engagement Group.

A Mass on Ukrainian Folksongs



Latest news from Newton Theological College in Papua New Guinea **Newton Theological College Project Update May 2023**

ABM has recently received a report from Acting Principal of Newton College, Bishop Jeffrey Driver, with an update on how things are going at the College.

There is now a full complement of lecturers, so that the students are in good hands. Fr Luscomb Bera returned to the College after completing his Bachelor of Theology and the Catholic Institute in Port Moresby. And Fr Newton Ekoda, whom many ABM supporters will remember as a youth minister, has also joined the College from the Christian Leaders Training College at Mt Hagen.

Currently there are 21 students – 14 final year students and seven students in their first year. These seven (pictured) are already ordained and will complete one year of studies to obtain a Diploma of Ministry.

The long journey to government registration and accreditation continues. As well as working hard to repair buildings and operational infrastructure, the College is in conversation with the Northern Provincial government regarding possible co-location of nursing and teaching colleges on the Newton site. Such a move would make for a much larger and more viable institution which could involve sharing a library, information technology and administration.

The long slow job of building renovation also continues. This year a portable sawmill was purchased by the College, enabling the milling of some of the on-site trees to be used in building. Using material available on-site will significantly reduce the cost of the building renovations. Four carpenters are currently employed for this purpose.

We thank all our supporters who have given so generously over the years to this project, and those who continue to give. Your donations fund vital infrastructure and operating costs, including staff salaries. Please continue to support Newton College, its staff, and students in your prayers as it meets its many challenges in faith, hope and hard work.
