

Music notes

We celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi this Sunday with music that focuses on the sacrament of Holy Communion. We begin with the introit 'O Taste and see' in a beautiful setting by Vaughan Williams, and our anthem is a beautiful setting of the text Panis angelicus (Bread of the angels) by the French composer César Franck, one of the greatest French composers and organists of the nineteenth century. The text is the second last verse of a hymn written for Corpus Christi by Thomas Aquinas in the thirteenth century:

*Thus Angels' Bread is made
the Bread of man today:
the Living Bread from heaven
with figures dost away:
O wondrous gift indeed!
the poor and lowly may
upon their Lord and Master feed.*



OVERSEAS



St John's Seminary in Kitwe, Zambia, nurtures the future leaders of the Anglican church in Zambia. In addition to proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God and nurturing new believers, church leaders in Zambia have been actively participating in significant moments for our country, such as challenging violence of every kind, and pursuing peace and reconciliation as well as the liberation struggle, democratization efforts, and the fight against social injustice. St John's students are proud to continue to proclaim this good news.

Bishop Newton School of Theology, Papua New Guinea, (formerly Newton Theological College), is now part of the newly-formed Modawa Institute of Higher Education. By training clergy and lay leaders to serve the church in a variety of roles, from parish priests to teachers and health workers, it is helping to build up the Anglican Church of PNG from its heart.



IN AUSTRALIA



The Coming of the Light project in the **Diocese of North Queensland** supports the **Meriba Maygi Zabeth Anglican Council** and the work of the Melanesian Brothers in the Torres Strait. The council name means "Our Holy Work" in the languages of the Torres Strait - "Meriba" means "Our" in the language of the Eastern Torres Strait Islands, and "Maygi Zabeth" means "Holy Work" in the languages of the Central and Western Torres Strait Islands. The council is still in its early stages of establishment, with members coming together from across the Torres Strait to determine priorities and plans for their collective work.

NATSIAC, the **National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglican Council**, seeks to be the primary voice for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglicans, promoting Gospel mission, encouraging ministry, and generating resources so that they may walk together with God and the wider church. The annual NATSIAC Gathering is an important coming together of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander leaders from across the Australian church. The Gathering is a place of mutual support, refreshment, collective discernment, and a prophetic wellspring that enriches our understanding of how God is at work in this land.
