## Rachmaninoff Meets Paganini

Sunday August 18 @ 2:30 pm - 4:00 pm



Erin Sweetman joins the Camerata in the ‘Rach-Pag’ – one of the epics of the piano repertoire. Numerous composers have made sets of variations on Paganini’s original melody, including Paganini himself, but none are more popular than Rachmaninoff’s brilliant work, which includes one of the greatest tunes of all time in the 18th Variation. The colour of Eastern European music continues in Kilar’s marvellous ‘Orawa’, an evocation of folk fiddlers on the Polish mountains. Also on the program, arrangements by our Principal Violist, Paul Groh, of delightful works by the German Baroque composer, Johann Groh, and a new work by Artistic Director, David Banney.



## The Monastery of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Stroud

### Sister Angela and her Sculptures in Christ Church Cathedral Newcastle

Wendy Hope Solling (1926 – 20 January 2002) was an Australian sculptor, [Anglican Franciscan nun](#), and one of the earliest women ordained in the [Anglican Church of Australia](#). She was born in Maitland. In her book 'Early Visions', Dr Margaret McBride writes about women artists of Newcastle and the Hunter Region.

*"She was always interested in healing work and considered studying medicine but was dissuaded by the general attitude that professional careers were wasted on girls".*

She moved to Sydney to study at East Sydney Technical College under sculptor Lyndon Dadswell (1945/46). In 1947 she travelled to London and studied at the Slade School and left to set up a studio in Chelsea where many of her wire sculptures were completed and in 1951 held her first solo show at Gallerie Appollinaire. In 1952 she returned to Australia...and had a solo exhibition at David Jones Art Gallery, Sydney. Despite a successful art career, inspired by a chance contact with a Franciscan priest, she returned to England to enter the Anglican Community of St Clare in 1955 taking the name of Sister Angela. In 1956 Sister Angela entered the closed order of St Clare of Assisi where she remained until returning to Australia in 1975 to found a similar community at Stroud.




The bronze sculpture is made from an original Terra-cotta maquette using the Lost Wax process. The sculpture is a lifelike interpretation. The bronze retains the qualities of the handwork.

A Faculty was given in 1955. A very different bronze abstract sculpture is the Bishop Shevill Memorial. It depicts Jacob's struggle with God. (Genesis 32:22-32)



'Her beliefs and sculptures were never a conflict; they worked in accord to relate the message of St Clare, whom Sister Angela considered one of the earliest feminists. St Clare embraced poverty, chastity and obedience to the church. At sixty-six Sister Angela decided to seek ordination. She built a second stage of her



monastery, named '[Gunya Chiara](#)' from the Aboriginal word for house and the Italian word for light (dedicated in 1997).' (Early Visions – Margaret McBride)
