Music notes

Last Sunday evening we remembered the anniversary of Hiroshima Day in our Evensong, and I was deeply moved by a quote from Leonard Bernstein that was part of the sermon. In response to the assassination of John F Kennedy, Bernstein gave a speech entitled 'An Artist's Response to Violence', and speaking on behalf of American musicians he said these words:

'This will be our reply to violence: to make music more intensely, more beautifully, more devotedly than ever before.'

As so many are saying right now, it is hard to imagine a time in human history when the world has been beset by so much violence, and Bernstein's words suggest that, perhaps, beauty can be antidote to violence.

This Sunday's music is certainly full of beauty, featuring composers who worked through the terrors of WWII. There is a fascinating connection here between Harold Darke and Herbert Howells. Early in the war Harold Darke deputized for Boris Ord as Music Director of Kings College Cambridge, while Ord worked in the Royal Air Force. A little later, Herbert Howells stood in for the organist Robin Orr at St Johns College, Cambridge. It was during this time that Howells composed one of his best-known works – the Magnificat and Nunc dimittis 'Collegium Regale'. This complicated title simple reflects the English habit of Latinizing the names of Oxford and Cambridge Colleges – 'Collegium Regale' simply means Kings College. The 'Coll Reg', as it is affectionately known, was composed late in the war, creating a new sound world in English church music. In Howells' own words:

"... if I made a setting of the Magnificat, the mighty should be put down from their seat without a brute force which would deny this canticle's feminine association. Equally, that in the Nunc dimittis, the tenor's domination should characterize the gentle Simeon. Only the Gloria should raise its voice."

Rachmaninoff Meets Paganini

Sunday August 18 @ 2:30 pm – 4:00 pm



Erin Sweetman joins the Camerata in the 'Rach-Pag' – one of the epics of the piano repertoire. Numerous composers have made sets of variations on Paganini's original melody, including Paganini himself, but none are more popular than Rachmaninoff's brilliant work, which includes one of the greatest tunes of all time in the 18th Variation. The colour of Eastern European music continues in Kilar's marvellous 'Orawa', an evocation of folk fiddlers on the Polish mountains. Also on the program, arrangements by our Principal Violist, Paul Groh, of delightful works by the German Baroque composer, Johann Groh, and a new work by Artistic Director, David Banney.
