Music notes

In this week's Eucharist our Mass is by the Spanish Renaissance composer Luis Victoria. Often dubbed the 'Spanish Palestrina', Victoria created a sound world all of his own, perhaps more sumptuous than Palestrina. Renaissance Masses were often based on plainsong melodies of the time, as is the case with this one. The hymn 'O quam gloriosum' (*O how glorious is the kingdom, wherein all the saints rejoice with Christ*) would have been well known to people of the time, and specifically composed for All Saints Day.

The Ordination of Women - in Newcastle Anglican Diocese 32 Years this year

Historic ceremony sees 11 women ordained in Christ Church Cathedral



The first woman priest to be ordained in Newcastle, Sister Angela, takes her vows at Christ Church Cathedral from Bishop Geoffrey Parker.

“Eleven women were ordained last night [21 December 1992] as Anglican priests at an historic ceremony at Christ Church Cathedral in Newcastle. More than 1000 people watched the moving ceremony which took more than three hours. It followed similar ceremonies in Goulburn and Brisbane over the weekend.” (The Newcastle Herald December 1992). The first woman priest ordained was **Sister Angela CSCI** (Stroud). The other ordained women were, The Reverends: Maree Armstrong, Sheila Bourne, Margaret Carr, Audrey Fuller, Dr Barbara Howard, Beatrice Pate, Dr Julia Perry, Pam Sauber, Val Tibbey and Jenny Willsher. Three men priests ordained were the Reverends:



Rod Bower, Brian Douglas and Ramsay Nuthall.

Dean Katherine Bowyer was installed as the first female Dean of Christ Church Cathedral on 4th October 2017 and **Bishop Sonia Roulston** was consecrated the first female bishop in the Diocese in May 2018



Celebrating the 80th anniversary of the first Anglican woman priest The Rev'd Dr Florence Li Tim-Oi was ordained on 25 January 1944. She was ordained Deacon on Ascension Day in 1941 after hearing the call to ministry 10 years earlier at the ordination of a deaconess in Hong Kong Cathedral. Florence was given charge of the Anglican congregation in the Portuguese colony of Macau where, at the time, refugees were fleeing to from China.

This year marks the 50th anniversary of the first of ordination of women as priests in The Episcopal Church (USA) on July 29, 1974

The journey towards ordination required a brave and visionary group of women and their allies to stand firmly in their beliefs and their faith, following the Holy Spirit where it led them. The challenges did not stop with ordination as women priests faced hurdles and pushback as they strived for equal footing in the church.

Celebrating the 30th anniversary of first 32 women who were ordained as Church of England priests on 12 March 1994. The service was officiated by Bishop Barry Rogerson at Bristol Cathedral.

The first woman to be consecrated as a bishop in the Anglican Church of Australia – 2008

When The Venerable Kay Goldsworthy was consecrated at St George's Cathedral in Perth on 22 May 2008, she became the first woman **bishop** in the Anglican Church in Australia.

Bishop Kay Goldsworthy became **the world's first female Anglican archbishop on 10 February 2018**, when she was installed as the first female archbishop in the Anglican Church of Australia.




