Finally, this week's poem is by Gillian Clarke, and I am indebted to Catherine Banney who brought it to my attention. As Clarke writes: "*All you need to know about this poem is that it is a true story. It happened in the '70s, and it took me years to find a way to write the poem.*" Poetry, music, art, performance, song: all these things and more, reach into our hearts, lives, and minds, in ways that are ineffable. I have experienced similar moments aged care ministry, and at hospital bedsides. Please take the time this Lent to feed your soul.

### **Miracle On St David's Day**

'They flash upon that inward eye  
which is the bliss of solitude'  
(from 'The Daffodils' by William Wordsworth)  
An afternoon yellow and open-mouthed  
with daffodils. The sun treads the path  
among cedars and enormous oaks.  
It might be a country house, guests strolling,  
the rumps of gardeners between nursery shrubs.  
I am reading poetry to the insane.  
An old woman, interrupting, offers  
as many buckets of coal as I need.  
A beautiful chestnut-haired boy listens  
entirely absorbed. A schizophrenic  
on a good day, they tell me later.  
In a cage of first March sun a woman  
sits not listening, not feeling.  
In her neat clothes the woman is absent.  
A big, mild man is tenderly led  
to his chair. He has never spoken.  
His labourer's hands on his knees, he rocks  
gently to the rhythms of the poems.  
I read to their presences, absences,  
to the big, dumb labouring man as he rocks.  
He is suddenly standing, silently,  
huge and mild, but I feel afraid. Like slow  
movement of spring water or the first bird  
of the year in the breaking darkness,  
the labourer's voice recites 'The Daffodils'.  
The nurses are frozen, alert; the patients  
seem to listen. He is hoarse but word-perfect.  
Outside the daffodils are still as wax,

a thousand, ten thousand, their syllables  
unspoken, their creams and yellows still.  
Forty years ago, in a Valleys school,  
the class recited poetry by rote.  
Since the dumbness of misery fell  
he has remembered there was a music  
of speech and that once he had something to say.  
When he's done, before the applause, we observe  
the flowers' silence. A thrush sings  
and the daffodils are flame.

## **Music notes**

This year the first Sunday in Lent coincides with International Women's Day, and we commemorate this with superb music, old and new. In the 10am Eucharist the Kyrie comes from a Mass by Hildegard of Bingen. Sadly, if she wrote music for the rest of the Mass, it has been lost, and so the other parts of the Mass are plainsong, recognizing our pattern of avoiding the rich sounds of the organ in our choral music during Lent and Advent. Our anthem is by the internationally acclaimed Icelandic composer Anna Thorvaldsdottir, whose accomplishments include the soundtrack for the movie *Tar*. In stark contrast to the highly dissonant music of *Tar*, this beautiful anthem captures the choral sound world of Scandinavia, setting the text:

*Hear us in heaven, O God.*

*Hear us in heaven, loving Father, as we, your small children,  
ask for the fortune to receive eternal life.*

*We shall not stray from your path.*

At Evensong our music includes two contemporary composers, Elizabeth Coxhead, whose music is capturing the hearts of English church musicians, and our own George Cole, one of our finest sopranos, who compose the Psalm chant for the service. The organist for Sunday's services will be Rosemary Ponnekanti, who is making an outstanding contribution not just to the music of the Cathedral, but to Newcastle and the Hunter Valley.






