

Simnel cake reminds us of the goodness of God's gifts, of food for the journey, and the sweetness of God's love. Perhaps this week you could do something to share the gift of God's goodness with someone you love and for whom you care.

Parish Council met on Wednesday this week. We received and discussed reports on parish safety, volunteer procedures, and security. We also received very detailed and informative reports from the Director of Music and the Dean's Verger. An enormous amount of work is given by our staff and volunteers to enable all that occurs within the parish, and I am deeply thankful and appreciative.

THE CATHEDRAL ROOF RESTORATION PROJECT: Sharon Dyett and I attended a meeting last week with two of the Project Managers for the Roof Replacement Project. We had hoped that the roof replacement works would begin in May, but it now looks like the earliest start date will be sometime in July. My understanding is that the tender will be awarded this week. There are also necessary permissions from Heritage and Newcastle Council which need to be in order before works can commence. As we receive more information, I will share it with you.

CHOIR TOUR: Last Saturday our choir is performed in Muswellbrook, raising over \$900 to support SRE in Schools in the Upper Hunter. Following this, the choir then travelled to Morpeth where they joined the community at St James Morpeth for Evensong. I am thankful for the ways in which the music ministry of the Cathedral is able to enrich the wider Diocese.

There are some wonderful concerts happening in the Cathedral soon too. One of the ways we can show our appreciation, and how much we value these opportunities, is by supporting them and sharing the information widely.

As a Parish Community, we strive to be a safe, welcoming, inclusive, and affirming place for all. We all have a part to play in this ongoing work. We are committed to the work of Makarrata – Reconciliation. Thank you also for your ongoing prayers for our LGBTQIA+ community, at this time when their validity and identity continues to be challenged and questioned. Finally, this week's poem is a lengthy – and powerful – poem by Denise Levertov about the Annunciation. On Tuesday of this past week we welcomed members of the Mothers' Union from throughout the Diocese to the Cathedral, for the annual celebration of the Annunciation, known as 'Lady Day'.

Levertov's poem explores the moment of the annunciation, and the ripples of that moment. I know that sometimes the formatting of the poem doesn't translate well to the pewslip, and often it doesn't hugely matter. What is your annunciation? Or Annunciations? Has it happened yet or are you waiting.

Annunciation

We know the scene: the room, variously furnished,
almost always a lectern, a book; always
the tall lily.

Arrived on solemn grandeur of great wings,
the angelic ambassador, standing or hovering,
whom she acknowledges, a guest.

But we are told of meek obedience. No one mentions
courage.

The engendering Spirit
did not enter her without consent.

God waited.

She was free
to accept or to refuse, choice
integral to humanness.

Aren't there annunciations
of one sort or another
in most lives?

Some unwillingly
undertake great destinies,
enact them in sullen pride,
uncomprehending.

More often
those moments
when roads of light and storm
open from darkness in a man or woman,
are turned away from
in dread, in a wave of weakness, in despair
and with relief.

Ordinary lives continue.

God does not smite them.

But the gates close, the pathway vanishes.

She had been a child who played, ate, slept
like any other child – but unlike others,
wept only for pity, laughed
in joy not triumph.

Compassion and intelligence
fused in her, indivisible.
Called to a destiny more momentous
than any in all of Time,
she did not quail,
only asked
a simple, 'How can this be?'
and gravely, courteously,
took to heart the angel's reply,
perceiving instantly
the astounding ministry she was offered:
to bear in her womb
Infinite weight and lightness; to carry
in hidden, finite inwardness,
nine months of Eternity; to contain
in slender vase of being,
the sum of power –
in narrow flesh,
the sum of light.
Then bring to birth,
push out into air, a Man-child
needing, like any other,
milk and love –
but who was God.
This was the moment no one speaks of,
when she could still refuse.
A breath unbreathed,
 Spirit,
 suspended,
 waiting.

She did not cry, 'I cannot. I am not worthy,'
Nor, 'I have not the strength.'
She did not submit with gritted teeth,
 raging, coerced.

Bravest of all humans,
 consent illumined her.
The room filled with its light,
the lily glowed in it,
 and the iridescent wings.

Consent,
 courage unparalleled,
opened her utterly.

Music notes

This Sunday morning we sing one of the most famous Mass settings of all time, and dearly loved by our choir. William Byrd is one of the most significant figures in the history of English church music. A generation younger than the equally important Thomas Tallis, Byrd built on a language inherited from European composers of the Renaissance, establishing, for the first time, a truly English sound. With Tallis, he dominated English music for many decades, helped no doubt by the fact that he and Tallis were awarded the first Royal License for publishing music. And beginning with Byrd, our music for the Eucharist ends with English music of a contemporary English composer, Elizabeth Coxhead and a beautiful setting of a text by Robert Bridges:

*My eyes for beauty pine,
My soul for Goddess grace :
No other care nor hope is mine,
To heaven I turn my face.*

*One splendour thence is shed
From all the stars above :
'Tis named when God's name is said,
'Tis Love, 'tis heavenly Love.*

*And every gentle heart,
That burns with true desire,
Is lit from eyes that mirror part
Of that celestial fire.*






If anyone knows of suitable accommodation it would be greatly appreciated.

Newy-Crisp are able to cover a reasonable level of rent. The family will wish to seek a longer-term accommodation option elsewhere once they have established their bearings and begun the process of assimilation within the community.

Additional to accommodation any donations of household items, white goods, linens etc would be greatly welcomed.

Your support of our refugee family would be of incredible value to them on their path to community integration and acceptance.
