

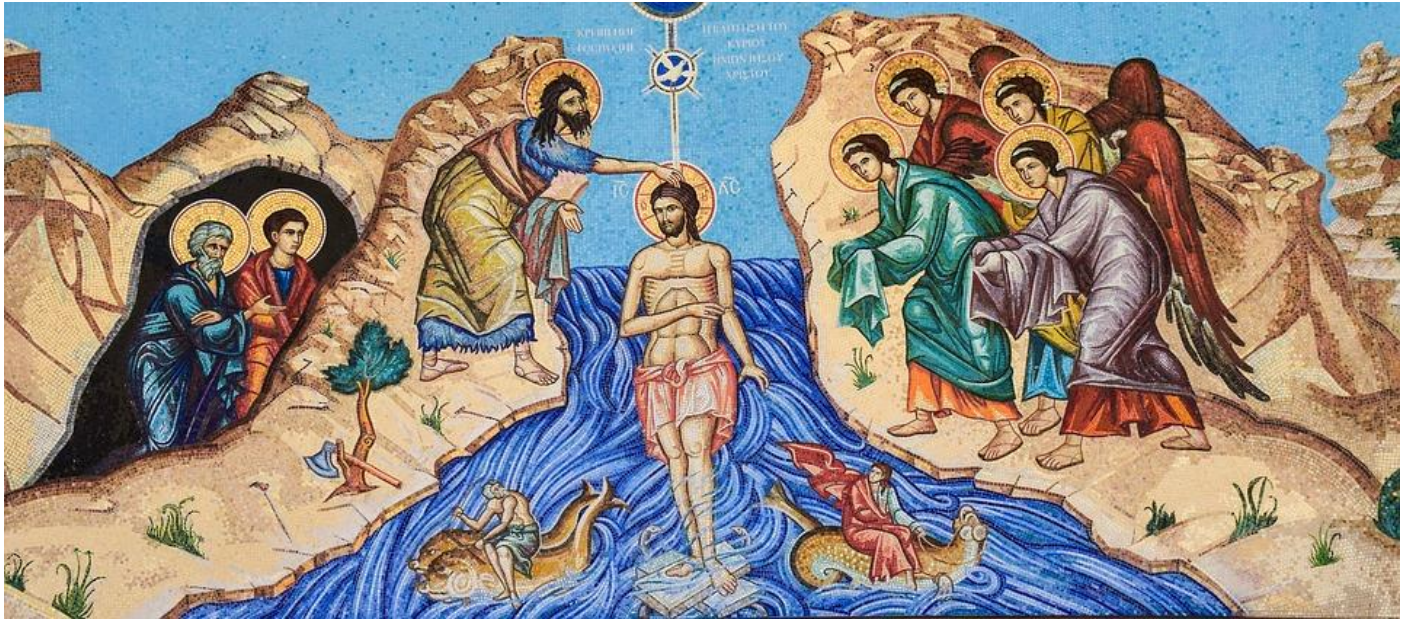

From The Very Reverend Geoff Miller, Dean of Newcastle (UK):

“Everyone joins me in sending our love and assuring you of our prayers. We watch the news clips with horror though we can hardly imagine the scale and velocity of what is happening. We are so deeply impressed with the work of the firefighters and emergency services and deeply troubled by the devastation so many are suffering. We pray for rain, for courage, for help and hope.”
