

Today, ABM supports projects throughout the Episcopal Church of Jerusalem and the Middle East such as the Diocese of Jerusalem's Empowering Youths with Disabilities program at the Princess Basma Centre. The centre supports young people's social inclusion and human rights while teaching vocational skills.</p> <p>Another example is ABM's support of the Diocese of Egypt's evangelism program as well as of their EpiscoCare agency. This year EpiscoCare wants us to help their healthcare program which seeks to improve the medical outcomes for children and vulnerable people in marginalized Egyptian communities.</p> <p>We are also supporting the Diocese of Cyprus and the Gulf's Student Chaplaincy at Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) in Famagusta, Northern Cyprus. Currently it is being led by Justin Arnott, a South African. Christian students from countries in Africa, Asia and the Middle East find spiritual support through the chaplaincy.</p>
