 - **At the Cathedral in the St Christopher Chapel, following the 9.30am Eucharist.**
 - **At St Peter's following the 7.30am Eucharist.**
- **The Hearing Loop covers pews two to six as indicated on the South side of the Cathedral. Please switch your hearing aid to the 'T' setting to benefit.**
- **An access ramp is situated on the harbour side of the Cathedral.**

From the Cathedral's Director of Music, Peter Guy...

It seems that during Lent we are spending a lot of time in the Renaissance - but who is to complain when there are such beautiful gems such as Palestrina's Sicut Cervus to be sung and heard!? A setting of Psalm 42:1 (As a deer longs for the running brooks: so longs my soul for you, O God). Palestrina's mastery of polyphony is at display here in one of his most loved and oft performed motets. The simple word-painting is effective: longer, rising melismatic passages (melisma = lots of notes on one syllable) to highlight the text "fontes aquarum" and "desiderat" are contrasted by the shorter, falling passages to highlight the text "anima mea" (my soul), which develops an ever-increasing sense of longing, just as the soul longs for God. The Magnificat at Evensong was composed by Fr Glen Hughes in response to the need for settings of the text as presented in the then-new A Prayer book for Australia (1995). Guided by Dr Christopher Dearnley (formerly Director of Music at St Paul's Cathedral, London), Fr Glen's setting intentionally avoids the bold "over the top" style prevalent in so many settings, and brings the text to life with a gentle lilt, portraying Mary singing her canticle with a youthful exuberance and wistful manner, seemingly un-perturbed by her role in the salvation of the world. Evensong is arguably the greatest liturgical gift the Anglican Communion has given to the Christian world. It is a service of great beauty, perfectly measured in its prayerfulness and worship. The choir sings much of the liturgy which allows the congregation to be drawn into a sense of quiet worship and meditation. Our Cathedral is the only Cathedral between Melbourne and Brisbane offering weekly Evensong on a Sunday night. This is a gift to be treasured. Please join us.
