## About today's music...

Charles Villiers Stanford (1852-1924) was one of the leading figures of British music composers of the Victorian and Edwardian eras. Following a decline in English music that could be traced back to the death of Purcell (if we consider Handel a German composer who just happened to be in England!), Stanford was one of those at the forefront of reversing the trend, along with the likes of CHH Parry (of "I was glad" fame). As the composition teacher at the Royal College of Music, Stanford influenced an entire generation of English composers including Holst, Howells, Ireland and Vaughan Williams, to name but a few, and his compositions for Anglican liturgy are held in the highest of regard nearly 100 years after his death! The anthem at Evensong is the second of three motets with Latin texts dedicated to the choir of, and Stanford's successor at Trinity College, Cambridge, Alan Gray. It is rightly regarded as one of Stanford's most exquisite unaccompanied compositions. The text is Psalm 119:1 "Beati quorum via integra est: qui ambulant in lege Domini", which translates, "Blessed are the undefiled in the way, who walk in the law of the Lord."
