The awards were presented at a special ABM gathering at the Diocesan Office on Friday 21 September to acknowledge past and present service to ABM in various capacities and over many years. The Coaldrake medal, named after the Rev'd Canon Frank Coaldrake who served as a missionary and later as Chairman of the ABM Board, is a means to recognise the valuable contribution of former ABM missionaries and staff members.

### **September Missions Project: LANGUAGE, LITERACY & NUMERACY, VANUATU**

Our partner church, the Anglican Church of Melanesia – Vanuatu (ACOM-V), is trying its best to respond to this need through its Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Program. This year, program is working with the Luganville Market for Change Association where



most vendors can't read or write. This often leaves vendors cheated on at the market by customers due to incorrect payment. There are dreams of establishing 2 new Community Learning Centres (CLCs) where students will learn a range of life-skills which will support them to find employment or start up their own small business. Communities will be encouraged to begin income generating projects so that the benefits flow into the whole community. *Thank you for your support!*
