BUSHFIRE APPEAL:

The Commissary, Bishop Sonia Roulston, has shared the following:

Dear Brothers and sisters,

As I write this we find ourselves in the midst of what some of the worst fire conditions our nation has known. Some of our own communities have also been severely impacted. In the last few days the images from the south coast of NSW and eastern Gippsland have been horrific, with a state of emergency being declared in both regions.

We are thankful to the many people who volunteer in bush and rural fire brigades and also through Anglicare and Samaritans Disaster Recovery. We continue to hold in prayer those directly affected by fires in our nation at this time, those communities devastated, and those who give of themselves in fighting these fires and defending communities. We continue to pray for success in their efforts, and for rain.

I have been in touch with the bishops of Canberra-Goulburn and Gippsland to ask if there is any way for people to contribute to aid funds at this time.

Bishop Richard Treloar (Gippsland) has replied:

Those looking to make a contribution to the east Gippsland situation that we can deploy immediately and directly to affected areas could donate to our diocesan Gippsland Emergency Fund as follows:

So guide and bless your people,
that we may enjoy the fruits of the earth
and give you thanks with grateful hearts,
through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.*

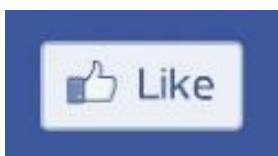
