## About today's music...

*Palestrina could well be described as the master of Italian renaissance polyphony, and his Missa Aeterna Christi Munera (as heard at today's 9:30am Eucharist) may well be one of the best works to highlight why. The setting is a "parody mass" - in other words, it takes its themes from a known work, in this case, the ancient hymn setting of the Ambrosian text Aeterna Christi Munera (The eternal gifts of Christ the King). It is known for its relative simplicity of line, its brevity, and its great beauty; the moment of greatest beauty can be found in the setting of the text "dona nobis pacem" in the second Agnus, heard today during communion.*

*The setting of the canticles for Evensong was inspired after I heard a plainsong and faux bourdon setting of the Latin Magnificat in Chichester Cathedral on a rather cold January evening in 2018. It combines unison verses for the choir alternating with simple quasi-faux bourdon verses, in which I aim to gently enhance the meditative nature of the chanting of the Latin text through interesting harmony and moments of simple counterpoint.*
