Royal Commission - The media has been giving a lot of attention to issues of child sexual abuse in the last weeks. Please be aware that the report on our Diocese (Case Study 42) will be published in the next few months and there will be no warning in advance. The full Royal Commission report is due in December. There will be press coverage particularly if the commission recommends prosecutions. The Healing Team are available to speak to anyone who has concerns now or when the report comes out. Please pray for the work of the Commission, for the welfare of survivors of abuse and for all whose lives have been affected.
